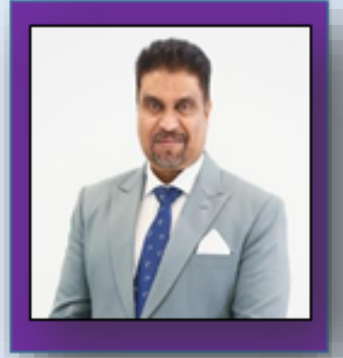

They created the planet Earth by painting it blue and green. The above pledge was taken by holding the created Mother Earth in their palm.



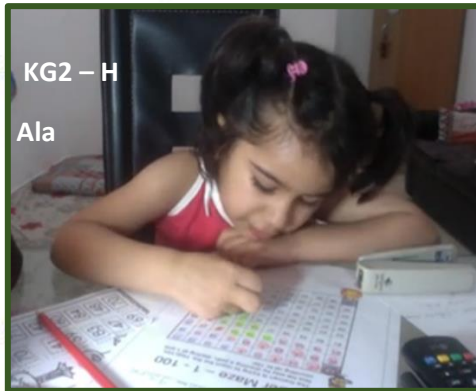
Literacy— Reading is to the mind, what exercise is to the Body - Sir Richard Steele.

General Awareness –Robert Urich, rightly said – *A healthy outside starts from the inside’.*

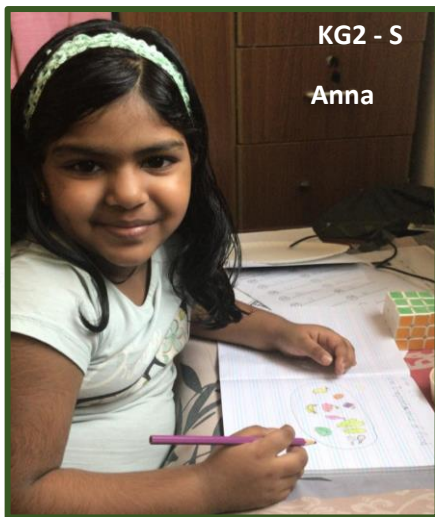
