We, at UIS are always expanding into new paradigms of learning. Our current passion and pursuit is to turn our students into high performance learners. We have invested our time, en-








Thank you for all your efforts. Our hearts go out to you as you work to support your children through these changes as well. Take very good care of yourself.


Science is brought to life in Grade 4 by students engaged in making cast fossils and mould fossils using play dough and by engineering a working model of the solar cooker from scratch.


















Mind Full or Mindful?



Chris Joseph Deepak and Sushmita Das from Grade 5 bagged the 1st Position in the art event, 'Easels of Earth'.




Sajini Varadharajan of Grade 5 bagged the fourth position in the creative story writing event, 'Story of Us' with her original: Smile! Mr. Ocelot


Kalos Ritmo 2020 - Calisthenics Championship













